Maundy is derived from the Latin word for "command" and refers to Jesus' commandment to the disciples to "Love one another as I have loved you." Due to his Jewish heritage, on that night Jesus was observing the Passover Seder, the feast of unleavened bread. Passover is the Jewish festival commemorating the exodus of the Jews from Egypt. The speed of their flight left no time for bread to rise.

I had a friend who said once the only difference between a rut and a grave is the depth. We can find ourselves in a rut too often if we don't have the courage or strength to notice and admit it. Being in a rut can stifle spiritual growth. It can even kill it if we aren't mindful.

Is there really only one way to do things? There are always choices we make every day. Whether it be the clothes we wear, the food we eat, the careers

we pursue; there are all of these choices. Do we ever think that even the spiritual ideas we have involve choices? Imagine eating the same food every day. Every day! Imagine wearing the same clothes every day. Every day! Or doing the same thing over and over and over. It has been said doing the same thing over and over and expecting change is a sign of insanity.

Well I suppose it depends on what that over and over again thing is. If it is a mindless rote activity I agree. But if it is the active pursuit of knowledge, ideas involving spiritual growth through contemplation and meditation and prayer in order to gain new insights into how to be more of the mind of Christ and devote our life activities to love one another as directed in Matthew 22:39, then that would be a good thing.

During Lent Christians should be engaged in a self-examining process looking for our strengths and weaknesses and how we go forward all year spiritually, growing in the love and knowledge of God. Jesus said we must become like little children. What did he mean? According to Billy Graham, it refers to becoming more humble, removing any sense of pride that we don't need God or Jesus or the Holy Spirit in our lives. We can do it our own way without God. He goes on to say we should renounce our pride and trust God as little children trust their parents. Fear, pride, embarrassment - whatever it is that could be holding us back, we must go to God, humbly praying for help. And as little children grow physically we will be growing spiritually as we actively seek God throughout the year. And rather than giving something up for Lent, take on things that reflect our love for God. As the Humble Servant is to us, be that humble servant to others. Thanks be to God!
