

## **Session Meeting Update**

March 11, 2021

- The Annual Congregational Meeting (normally held the last week in January) has been set for April 11, 2021, following worship. At that time, there will be an opportunity to ask questions about the annual reports, election of nominating committee at large members, and election of one Deacon to fill an open seat. If you are attending services via Zoom and wish to place names in nomination (yourself or others) from the floor for nominating committee or Deacon, please forward this information to Pastor Norlita or Terry Spitzenberger prior to the meeting.
- Session received a letter from the Brookings United Church of Christ indicating that they do not plan to renew the yoking agreement which will expire on May 15, 2021. Session concurred with the decision and will forward this information to Presbytery. The Pastor will return to full-time service to this congregation after May 15, with salary returning to he original contract amount.
- Session received a report from Deacons- they are working to support the members of the congregation- look for a monthly call, card, or email from your Deacon and connect with them!
- The Building and Grounds committee reports that there has been some damage to the parking rea from construction equipment being used next door. Terry S. has contacted the city and they will repair the damage after construction is completed
- The Worship Committee has been working on a Liturgist list- if you would like to serve as a liturgist- contact Rozanne or Dolores and they will make sure you get on the list.
