



### MEN'S BROTHERHOOD April 2022 Andrew L'Amour



Men's Brotherhood Notes: Men's Brotherhood met on March 17. We opened our meeting to anyone in the church who wished to come. We had about 20 who attended that evening. (A side note: We delivered an extra spaghetti meal to another 15 who were shut-ins and others unable to attend that event!) Susan Hugghins presented the program. She spoke about her translation work in Oaxaca Mexico and working with translating the bible into Mixtec. Quite a challenge and difficult project. It was a very interesting program.

Matthew 19:14 "Jesus said, Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." What did Jesus mean by these words?

Some commentaries share that children have a strong faith. The children's faith, trust and believe in their older adult parents' leadership, love and care given by their caretakers. The child sees themselves as identifying with their older parent/caretakers. Thus we should be identifying ourselves to be living as Christ lived – loving God the Father and loving our fellow human beings.

Children often have qualities of trust and a sense of "humble openness" in their dealings with others. Obviously this can change over the years where some of these qualities get jaded and shaded. Jesus exhorted us in this scripture to recapture those qualities found in our young people and qualities we had when we were as children. We need to inculcate these qualities into our lives and present ourselves an example to other new Christians. Children and new Christians should never be considered irrelevant. Everyone needs to be highly considered and treated with respect. Young person or old person, New to the faith or experienced. Regardless of social standing. All are welcomed, to be loved, respected and brought into the fold.

### **Revelings for April 2022**











This year, as we've been journeying together in prayer through Lent, our question "where are you leading us O God?" as God's people called First Presbyterian Church Brookings, this requires us to sharpen our vision. What is it we're looking for? Who is it we're looking for? Why are we looking for it?

Psalm 26:3,8 and 12 tell us, "For your steadfast love is before my eyes, and I walk in faithfulness to you. O Lord, I love the house in which you dwell, and the place where your glory abides. My foot stands on level ground; in the great congregation I will bless the Lord."

We are reminded of these verses in the of hymn from our Celtic Heritage (Ireland) as Presbyterians, "Be Thou My Vision." There's a beauty to the story about this hymn, as found on <a href="https://songsandhymns.org">https://songsandhymns.org</a>. Here it is:

With its heartfelt poetry and moving melody, "Be Thou My Vision" beautifully expresses the desires of the Christian heart. Though its popularity rose only in the past fifty years or so, the hymn actually has a rich history dating back to the eighth century.

Between the years of 400 and 700 AD the Irish people lived out a passionate faith in Christ. Ireland took up the missionary endeavor with excitement, and the country became known for its all-absorbing efforts to share Christianity throughout the world. Irish missionaries were found from Scotland to Switzerland, spreading the Good News wherever they went.

Some scholars believe that the words to the hymn are the product of a man known simply as St. Patrick. Patrick was born in A.D. 373 along the banks of the River Clyde in what is now called Scotland. When he was 16 he was kidnapped by pirates and taken as a slave to Ireland. There he gave his life to Jesus Christ. He eventually escaped, but he never forgot this experience and when he was about 30 he returned to his former captors with only one possession: the Latin Bible. History tells us that St. Patrick was the man most responsible for the Good News of Christ coming to Ireland. As a result of his preaching, over 200 churches were established and 100,000 converts were baptized.

"Be Thou My Vision" undoubtedly comes from this spiritually rich period. Its prominent theme encourages single-hearted focus and devotion to Christ. In the hymn lyrics, the poet expresses his adoration of God through the many titles he gives him: Vision, Wisdom, Word, Great Father, Power, Inheritance, High King of heaven, Treasure, bright heaven's Sun, Ruler of all.

Today, we continue to sing the words of this hymn, echoing the poet's response to God's many titles. "Thou my best thought, Thy presence my light."

As we move into the last days of Lent, awaiting the coming of Easter, the vision of our lives and church must be, the images of Holy Week's profound meaning. Without the Last Supper, Christ's death on the cross and glorious resurrection from the tomb, what would our vision be? We would still be wandering through the darkness of this world. Christ's resurrection brings us into the glorious light of God's glory to be enjoyed eternally. For this we say thanks be to God! New life does spring forth, and we welcome the promises and hope of Easter and Spring. Blessings to you and yours as you celebrate the greatest story ever told! Soli Deo Gloria, Rev. Norlita


