This project combines the efforts of many individuals, churches, service groups, school counselors, Social Service agencies, the Salvation Army, local businesses, and many other groups who have concern for children. Due to COVID-19, the committee is requesting monetary donations in lieu of supplies. The committee will then purchase supplies needed. Monetary gifts will be received at the next two Sunday (August 2 & 9) worship services.

# Congregational Meeting Updates July 26, 2020

Session has begun conversation with Brookings United Church of Christ at their request about entering into a shared pastor possibility between the two churches. No formal decisions have been made to date. The Session will keep the congregation informed concerning this request.

Rick Salonen was elected to fill the vacancy on the Nominating Committee.

#### **Mid-Year Financial Status**

Dave Peterson. Treasurer

As of June 30, 2020, we have \$74,185.12 in the checking account and have a net Ordinary Income of \$6,304.88. Compare this to 2019 where the numbers were \$52,471.69 and \$4,789.41. Also, the first half income and first half expenditures were quite similar. Initially this looks good but we have experienced some irregularities over the past year. For much of 2019 we did not have a Pastor and thus did not spend approximately \$57,500 of the budgeted amount. As a result, we ended 2019 with a \$19,492 budget surplus, increasing the checking account balance.

Looking forward to the second half of this year using the second half of last year and making adjustments for salary and other changes we will likely end the year with expenditures exceeding income by at least \$15,000. Realize it is difficult to make accurate projections with so many variables so track the progress as we continue to provide monthly reports to the congregation.

## Session Meeting Update July 9, 2020

Session has called a congregational meeting for July 27th for the purpose of electing an at-large member of the nominating committee to complete Gary Larson's term. There will also be an update on the church finances at this meeting.

Session has contacted United Church of Christ, Brookings, to continue the conversation regarding sharing a pastor. A meeting will be planned in July with our session and their board to begin conversations.

Building and Grounds reports that the church water heater has broken and is being replaced. In addition, new extinguishers will be purchased to meet the new fire code for FE13 clean agent extinguishers.

Christian Education reports that Sunday School will resume September 13th, assuming we are still worshiping in the building at that time. If not, options for virtual Sunday school will be explored.

#### **Revelings August 2020**

#### **COMMUNITY IS CARING**

#### Romans 12:3-13

3 For by the grace given to me I say to everyone among you not to think of yourself more highly than you ought to think, but to think with sober judgement, each according to the measure of faith that God has assigned. <sup>4</sup>For as in one body we have many members, and not all the members have the same function, <sup>5</sup>so we, who are many, are one body in Christ, and individually we are members one of another. <sup>6</sup>We have gifts that differ according to the grace given to us: prophecy, in proportion to faith; <sup>7</sup>ministry, in ministering; the teacher, in teaching; <sup>8</sup>the exhorter, in exhortation; the giver, in generosity; the leader, in diligence; the compassionate, in cheerfulness.

#### Marks of the True Christian

9 Let love be genuine; hate what is evil, hold fast to what is good; <sup>10</sup>love one another with mutual affection; outdo one another in showing honour. <sup>11</sup>Do not lag in zeal, be ardent in spirit, serve the Lord. <sup>12</sup>Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. <sup>13</sup>Contribute to the needs of the saints; extend hospitality to strangers. http://bible.oremus.org/ NRSV

We continue with the second installment in the series of "Community Is" drawn from the Todaydevotional.com website by Bret Lamsma, adapted for our own church community and family. Drawing from the verses in Romans 12, we see the emphasis by Paul on God's grace, the measure of faith we're assigned/given, the spiritual gifts in a variety of forms also bestowed upon us by God. We also see the admonition to continue in patience, diligence, extending hospitality and compassion, but most of all to continue not just have hope, but rejoice in it (Paul's words). All of these are things we may struggle with at times under the best of circumstances, and they may become almost impossible in the very trying times of crisis, even a global pandemic. As we've seen since March, everything has changed, swiftly in ways that have made or can make us uneasy. Hope may seem fleeting, rejoicing, well.....

Here are some thoughts that Lamsma wrote reflecting the Romans 12 verses:

Concerning a recent passing of a person, "Care was expressed in tangible ways. People brought them (the family) meals, and many others prayed for them and sent cards, a number of people gave hugs when they were needed. (Obviously before our pandemic when it was safe to do so). Some supporters had dealt with similar situations before, and others could only sympathize, having little idea what (the person) and family were dealing with. But the entire community cared for them in whatever way they could. Paul, in Romans 12, urges his listeners to use whatever gifts they have been given to their fullest ability. What matters is that we use them to the best of our ability for the good of others. In community, people care for each other. They use their gifts to help each other and to see that anyone who is wounded or hurting or in some other difficulty is looked after and loved. Sometimes healing is possible. Other times mourning and support are needed when healing won't take place. At times we all need caring for. Having a community around us to do that, is essential."

As I've observed our church family as community of faith during these last six months, I stand amazed at how much all that Lamsma describes is demonstrated here. Even as this time of pandemic has come to and upon us. I've heard amazing words about meals delivered, doctor appointment driving help, phone calls made, emails sent, cards and flowers delivered. How amazing is the what that our church family loves and cares for those in the kingdom of God, inside and outside of our church's walls. Thank you for being the body of Christ. Keep up your hope, keep using your gifts as

God calls us to be faithful. And let's continue to find ways to rejoice each day, even in the smallest of ways. Stay safe, strong and blessed.
