

PIECES and PRAYER

A small group has been meeting at the church to sew together pieces of fabric and creating Prayer Quilts. First, let me tell you what a prayer quilt is, what its purpose is, and who sews, ties, knots, prays, and who receives one. Anyone who can cut, match, sew, thread a needle and tie a knot or cheer us on can participate. At this time we have two young people working with us and the experience is wonderful. And there is a special spot waiting for you too, no age or gender limits.

A prayer quilt is sewn in a variety of patterns and fabric and then tied with yarn or crochet thread. When it is time to present the quilt to a person who is in need of prayers, either for healing, encouragement or celebration, the quilt is dedicated, and members of the congregation are encouraged to tie a knot and say a prayer for the recipient, then sign a card. This is a physical sign of our love and prayers for God's people, not just the congregation, but friends and loved ones of our members

We have been so fortunate to have much (and I mean a lot) of fabric donated to the cause. This was the gift that really got us serious after a lot of talk and prayer that we needed to do this. We recently had a sewing machine given to us that means we don't have to carry our machines every time. We do have a wish list--another machine (or two), sewing scissors, bobbins for Singer machine, batting, large eye needles, thread-both for sewing and crochet thread for tying, notions of all kinds, such as pins, rulers, rippers, etc., extension cords and of course money to buy what we need and do not have. If you are down-sizing and have retired your sewing room, please consider what we may be able to use for this mission project. And if you feel the need to create again, come and join us.

Because we are not always on top of things, we are going to have a "suggestion box", which will probably look a lot like an envelope on the Volunteer Bulletin Board. If you know of anyone who should receive a quilt, please share that person's name with Lee Peterson, Bonnie Foster, Nancy Thompson, Dolores Canaday, Paige Foster, Gayle Foster, Secretary Rozanne or put in the suggestion box.

This is an exciting adventure and I hope you will join the fun and fellowship. Meetings are set for the second Sat. at 9:30 AM so that the school children can participate. We try to be done by 11:30. We will be meeting in a new location which is the quilting room on the main floor of the church. Our next meeting will be on **December 8.** If you have questions you can contact any of the persons above. See you there!
