

Financial Issues facing the congregation.

Church officers, boards and committees spend a great deal of time making sure to find ways to be a loving, prayerful and well-maintained place to worship and provide space for activity.

Real Clean, a professional cleaning company has been approved by the Session to make our facilities a clean, welcoming place.

However, at nearly double what we budgeted for this year, we need to find ways to make that part of how we maintain our space.

Church staffing needs also need to be considered. That includes hiring a choir director and continuing to search for someone to direct youth activities. We are excited about the potential growth these investments will make in our church.

All of this means, though, that we will spend significantly more money next year. Normally we would look to cut the budget in other places, but since we have been doing that over the last few years, there isn't much left to be trimmed.

The bottom line is that we encourage the congregation to prayerfully consider support for our church maintenance and programmatic activity with their giving.

Please know that our pastor, session, church boards and committees carefully and prayerfully seek God's direction and ultimately God's sustaining grace in all that we do.
