Another one we trade "dad" jokes when we see each other. Several I visit with because I wear a rotation of baseball caps from different teams and we chat up baseball. Sometimes people initiate the conversation with me because of they are familiar with the team logo on my cap.

I know some of this seems trivial but in Matthew 22:37-39 Jesus says to love God with all our might and to love others as ourselves. God made everyone and loves everyone. No exceptions. So we should love everyone. So when I see someone to chat with, I treat them as I would anyone I loved because I do love them as commanded. And I try to always treat people in a friendly manner because that is how I would want to be treated. As a friend. So as Lent is coming up this is a pro-active thing for me to do – to try to meet and/or greet at least one new person every day. I hope you join me in this.

Susan's Saga

A couple of concepts from a passage of Scripture from II Corinthians have relevant insights.

One concept has to do with giving being a chain. Those who are giving donate to Paul, who is an intermediary for taking the gifts to the recipients. Those receiving, in turn, give thanksgiving to God. And there is a

reverberation effect as the praise and thanksgiving are reflected back to the original donors, giving them reason to glorify God. It is not only cyclical, as believers give and receive and give again, but also there is a crescendo of thanksgiving to God by all parties: givers, receivers, and intermediaries.

A second thought from this passage is that seed is often a metaphor for God's Word. In the Gospels, Jesus frequently refers to God's Word as being like seed that is sown, with the potential for growth and harvest. Bible translation is directly involved in making that precious seed available to people groups who do not yet have access to God's Word in their heart language.

So these verses are meaningful on several fronts, and it provides an apt opportunity to express gratitude to those who are part of this ongoing chain of providing the seed of Scripture to this group of Mixtec people.

"Now he who supplies seed to the sower and bread for food will also supply and increase your store of seed and will enlarge the harvest of your righteousness. You will be made rich in every way so that you can be generous on every occasion, and through us your generosity will result in thanksgiving to God." II Corinthians 9: 10-11

May you be blessed as you provide the blessing of God's Word to others.
