



Men's Brotherhood Update

Men's Brotherhood Notes: At our December 2017 regular meeting we enjoyed a sumptuous repast followed by a discussion of the Scout Troop 14 and Adam Young's Eagle Scout project. It was decided to hold a fundraiser pancake feed in January to help raise funds for the project which is improving a multi-purpose area in the old part of the church basement. January 2018's meeting was held on the 18th. Alan Young gave an additional update on the scout program in the church summer programs and planning for the annual troop fund raiser that will be held on February 18. Next month's meeting will be held February 15.

Action: Be supportive of one another's efforts as we live our lives in loving service to God and to one another.

When I am doing household chores at the end of the day, cleaning the kitchen, doing the dishes, I like to listen to different speakers on the Internet. There are a lot of excellent discussions presented by people like Neil Degrasse Tyson for one. Presenters on Krista Tippets' show On Being are a favorite source also. One of the people I have recently discovered is Richard Rohr, a Franciscan friar. He has written mostly on progressive religious issues and thought. He is a much sought after speaker and challenges people to think beyond established boundaries of faith.

I was listening one night to him and he said

something that I cannot forget. He spoke of the Hebrew word for God YHVH, which the actual pronunciation was considered unspeakable. He mentioned the word is made by the sound of inhalation and exhalation. What he was saying is that as we take our first breath at birth we are saying God's name. And when we take our last breath when we die, we are saying God's name, and when we take every breath in between we are saying God's name. It was an interesting thought with myriad applications.

Other biblical interpretations of the scripture Exodus 20:7 say not to swear or use foul language, mostly to not use the Lord's name in vain. We often think about this as just swearing, using God's name in some horrific epithet or other crude language. Bad as that is there is more to this. When I looked at this it came to me that as we live and breathe, what ever we do or say, and even as we think, we are breathing. A breath in, a breath out. God's name in and God's name out. Then what we do as we breathe is important that we not do it in vain, or in futility, selfishly, useless. What are we commanded to do in Matthew 22:36-40? Love and serve God and love our fellow person as much as we love ourselves. When we hold the mirror up to the things we say and do and think, are we doing them in vain?

Christ said in Mark 7:7 "In vain do they worship me, teaching as doctrines the precepts of men." Do not worship God in vain. Do not live your life in vain. Do not live it in a selfish, self-centered way that does not glorify God. Love God, serve God, love your neighbor, serve your neighbor. As we live and breathe this is what we are commanded to do. In all things we should give glory and honor to God. As we breathe in and as we breathe out.

From Presbytery's New Horizons: Why Per Capita is Important

We can't do it alone.

The work of the church is too big and too complex for just our local congregations to handle. We can't address world poverty, fight for justice in our country, educate and raise up leaders, or develop worship and educational materials just by our lonesome selves. We need the wider church. We need bodies like the Presbytery, Synod,



and General Assembly.

But for these councils to serve us we need to give them resources. That is why giving to per-capita is so important. These funds aren't about any particular social, political or theological agenda, it is about being true to our values as Presbyterians to remain connectional and one body.

Per capita this year is \$29.13.

The Christian Education committee is planning a new format for Vacation Bible School. Instead of holding



the event for a full week, we plan to hold it for four days throughout the month of June. As the lives of our children become more complicated, we seek to keep Christ in their lives. Sometimes that means rethinking our traditional programs and trying to find ways to accomplish similar goals with new methods. The dates we've chosen are:

The format for each evening will be similar to our traditional VBS—dinner, music, Bible stories, games, and activities.
