

Session Meeting Update June 11, 2020

Session approved the recommendation from the Worship committee that worship be held at the Band Shell in Pioneer Park each Sunday in June. The cost to the church is \$16.50 per week. Assuming there is no spike in COVID-19 cases in our area, worship will return to the Sanctuary with special accommodations on July 5th.

The Outreach committee is considering participating in a food distribution project through the Society of St. Andrew and funded by the USDA. Session has requested that the Outreach committee discuss this further and develop a careful plan for consideration, possibly in July.

Session approved Pastor Norlita's request for a continuing education day (June 28th). This time will be used for planning and recharging. During the pandemic quarantine time, Pastor Norlita has participated in several online continuing education experiences and this time lets her set aside time to think carefully about how these experiences can be implemented in her ministry.

Susan Smith was elected as commissioner to the Presbytery for the July 11th meeting. At this Presbytery meeting Ruling Elders Elizabeth Fox, Robby Flint, and Donna Flint will be commissioned as commissioned ruling elders to the Presbytery of South Dakota. According to the Book of Order, here are the functions of a Commissioned Ruling Elder:

"...the presbytery may authorize a ruling elder to be commissioned to limited pastoral service as assigned by the presbytery...Presbytery, in its commission, may authorize the ruling elder to moderate the session of the congregation to which he or she is commissioned, to administer the sacraments, and to officiate at marriages where permitted by state law (G-2.1001)."

Session considered a letter received from the United Church of Christ of Brookings to begin a dialogue about the possibilities of sharing ministry between our two congregations. The understanding of session is that this is a request to share a pastor, but NOT to merge the two congregations. Session discussed this possibility and the motion to contact UCC to indicate our willingness to enter into this dialogue carried.



The following guidelines have been established by Session because we love you.

Social gathering:

An important part of the Christian community is time of social gatherings- a time when we can share our lives with those we have come to love and cherish.

When chatting with others please **wear your mask** and only gather outside- either before or after church. Remember that the CDC stresses that the wearing of a mask should **supplement social distancing** (6-foot separation), not replace it.

Remember that wearing a mask is not for your own protection; it's for the protection of others. Wearing a mask is a way of demonstrating your **Christian love for others**.

If you use the public restroom, we ask that you use the disinfectant wipes provided on the bathroom fixtures before and after use. Please put used wipes in the trash can. Do not flush the wipes! There will be hand sanitizer available inside and outside the restroom. Please use this for your protection.

Though you may chat with others while remaining socially distant prior to the church service, we ask that **once the prelude begins, you sit quietly** and enjoy the music as it prepares you for worship. Please do not socialize once the music has begun-trying to speak over the music and through the mask raises the possibility of virus spread.

Similarly, after the worship service, please **do not socialize during the postlude**. When you are ready to leave, please leave quietly and if you wish to socialize, move outside.

Coming to worship:

As you enter the building with your mask on, please only use those parts of the church building that get you to the sanctuary. Both the basement and upstairs will be marked off to not be used.

As you enter the sanctuary, please **use the hand sanitizer** provided at the entry.

You may leave any **offering** in the containers provided at the door. There will not be a time to pass the plate.

There will be **no printed bulletins**, but all you need will be on the screen at the front of the sanctuary. The bulletins will also be available online if you wish to print or bring a device to use during the service.

As you seat yourself, please sit only in the designated areas with household groups sitting together and separate from other groups, using the CDC social distancing guidelines. **Pews will be marked** so you will be able to identify appropriate places to sit.

During worship:

Please keep your mask on during the entire service.

Because **music** has historically been important to members of this church, we will continue to enjoy music-including a prelude, one hymn, special music, and a postlude. Please enjoy and participate in this as you can while still wearing your mask.

On **Communion Sunday**, Communion will be served at the front of the sanctuary by Pastor Norlita and one elder. You will walk to the front to receive bread and the cup. Please maintain 6-foot distance from others around you as you wait for your turn and return to your seat.

There will **not be a time of sharing the microphone** for announcements or for sharing of joys and concerns. *Please send any announcements, joys, and concerns to Pastor Norlita either through email or phone call prior to Sunday morning.*

It is a time of turmoil in our society. Senseless shootings, millions living in poverty, and desperate souls are being turned away at our country's borders. The Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) has been called to be the hands and feet of Christ. The 224th General Assembly (2020) of the PC(USA) has been an important one for our denomination.

The Reverend Dr. J. Herbert Nelson, II, Stated Clerk of the General Assembly of the PC(USA), asks every congregation and every member to join other church leaders as we pray each day for these elected to serve. We also pray for our Commissioners whose work will continue until the next General Assembly is held.

We now pray for Elona Street-Stewart, executive of the Synod of Lakes and Prairies (https://www.lakesandprairies.org/), and the Rev. Gregory Bentley, pastor of Fellowship Presbyterian Church (https://www.fcphuntsville.org/) in Huntsville, Alabama, who were overwhelmingly elected to be co-moderators of the 224th General Assembly Saturday. Immediately after their election, the two were installed as co-moderators by the co-moderators of the 223rd General Assembly.

Asked how Presbyterians can be n prayer for their new leaders, Bentley identified three prayer requests: for stamina, perseverance and patients. "We are going to pack a lot into the next two years," he said. "We are excited about it, but we know it will be taxing."

Revelings July 2020

Community Is.....

This month begins a series of reflections on the various aspects of a Community of Faith, for my Revelings articles. The genesis for this comes from a similar series that was a part of the Today Devotional Series, todaydevotional.com. During these next months it is my deepest hope that our own Community of Faith, First Presbyterian Church (FPC) will continue to Love, Grow and Serve, just as it has since its inception.

'Will You Let Me Be Your Servant (The Servant Song)' #727 in the PCUSA Hymnal Glory To God, the verses therein speak well of what being in community is and will be. The text reads:

- vs. 1 & 6: Will you let me be your servant, let me be as Christ to you? Pray that I may have the grace to let you be my servant too.
- vs. 2: We are pilgrims on a journey; we're together on the road. We are here to help each other walk the mile and bear the load.
- vs. 3: I will hold the Christ-light for you in the nighttime of your fear. I will hold my hand out to you, speak the peace you long to hear.
- vs. 4: I will weep when you are weeping; when you laugh I'll laugh with you. I will share your joy and sorrow till we've seen this journey through.
- vs. 5: When we sing to God in heaven, we shall find such harmony, born of all we've known together of Christ's love and agony.

Bret Lamsma wrote about Community Is... Ever Changing, using I Cor. 9:22 as text. "I have become all things to all people so that by all possible means I might save some."

Lamsma admits that "this explanation by Paul...confused me." I have to admit that when I first encountered this scripture, I wasn't so much confused, but overwhelmed. How can a human being become all things? It sounded like only mythical characters with superpowers could do this. Then the question entered the picture, "how was Jesus able to do this?" Reflective prayer time entered into the picture. It's taken more than a decade on this one and still, I'm not done. I've resigned myself to realize that I won't be done in the human lifetime, and I'm ok with it.

Lamsma went on to write, "It seems like he (Paul) was not being authentic by changing the way he acted in order to influence people for the gospel. The longer I live in community and the more life circumstances I go

through, the more I think I understand... I look at this message in light of **community and everything it can be.** What I need from community today is different from what I needed 10 or 20 years ago. When...in high school...I needed my community to listen to me rage against God and love me anyway. When my children were younger, my wife and I needed people to watch them for us and to listen to us when we wondered how to parent them. Today our needs are different. The same could be said of everyone...a year from now or even a month from now, they might describe community differently...With the grace of Jesus Christ, be all things to all people. For those who are hurting...come and cry alongside. For those rejoicing...celebrate. It can offer so much because it is so deep. It is ever changing to reflect who God is in the ever-changing world around us. Whatever you are in need of today, the community of God's people is there to be Christ for you."

For me, the idea of community was also about servanthood, which is why, upon reading Lamsma's thoughts, the aforementioned hymn came to mind. Our community of faith is so blessed to have many loving and caring people within it. Our Deacons and Session members, along with the various committee members/friends work collaboratively to help us all to continue to love, to serve and to grow.

Many of our members/friends could identify with Lamsma's thoughts as I did, for community does change as we change, as we love, serve and hopefully grow, day by day, week by week, month by month and year by year. The Kingdom Of God is not static, it is ever evolving, ever creating/generating and re-creating/regenerating. We are the church formed, ever reforming. It's our reformed theological tradition's way of saying, as Lamsma titled his thoughts, "Community Is...Ever Changing."

During this time of the COVID-19 Pandemic, we are being asked to do things in new ways, ever-changing ways, even in our usual and customary ways of living our lives, including how/when and where we worship our dynamic Triune God. Let us as the FPC Community of Faith answer God's calling to "Love, Serve, Grow", ever evolving, ever reforming, for the Glory of God. Let us continue to pray for all humankind during these days of uncertainty.


