




Day of Pentecost is on **June 5**, **2022**. We are encouraging everyone to wear red on June 5th in recognition of Pentecost.

The recent storm in Brookings caused a lot of damage up and down nearly every street. We lost one big spruce, and the tops of four Ponderosa pine, plus one other Ponderosa pine that had deep root issues and another previously damaged Ponderosa pine. We saved one good Ponderosa pine and a large stump I have some hopes for, not sure what yet. Thankfully no damage done to any structure, vehicle or person!!

I called my tree service friends who put me on their list but since we were in no immediate danger of anything we were down the priority list a ways. When I talked to him he sounded exhausted and said it could be weeks before he could get over.

My wife who is more ambitious and adventurous than I am was out and about checking on other's peoples damage looking for places that may need help and came across a group called the Samaritan's Purse. This is a ministry of Franklin Graham, son of Billy Graham.

Samaritan's Purse mission statement is: SP is nondenominational evangelical Christian organization providing spiritual and physical aid to hurting people around the world. Since 1970, Samaritan's Purse has helped meet the needs of people who are victims of war, poverty, natural disasters, disease and famine with the purpose of sharing God's love through His son Jesus Christ.

Although they were not the only ones to help, and we are blessed with great neighbors and friends, and people we did not know who just came by. The SP folks had the organization, equipment and people power to get the work done, I still cannot believe how much work they got done in a half day.

Before sharing closing prayers Beth and I were presented with a beautiful bible signed by all the folks who helped us. Thanks be to God!!!
