"I am the vine, you are the branches. If a man remains in me and I in him, he will bear much fruit. Apart from me, you can do nothing." John 15:5.


Be a morning glory! Don't be a lonely little petunia in an onion patch.

Mayor's Award for Historic Preservation given to First Presbyterian

Work that was done the summer of 2015, to preserve and restore the bell tower has been



recognized by the Brookings Historic Preservation Commission and the mayor with the Mayor's Award for Historic Preservation. The award is being given in the category of "Ongoing Excellence in Restoration" for work done early July 2015 by Olson Masonry to caulk and repair crumbling mortar in our 117-year old structure. The roof was also worked on in early September 2015 by J & P Roofing.

Everyone is invited to attend the Mayor's Award Reception on Wednesday, July 19 from 5-7 pm at the McCory Gardens Education and Visitor Center.

"Each of us takes pride in our city, and it gives us great pleasure to recognize your extraordinary efforts made to preserve the historic character of Brookings," wrote Mayor Keith Corbett and Historic Preservation Commission Chair Angela Boersma.

Action: Be active in supporting the causes in our community that fulfill our commitment to Christ such as caring for the hungry, the sick, those in prison, etc. Love one another.

I began last month's column with a story about a sermon I heard with an example of a candle and the light that it brought to a darkened room. The transformation was a powerful message about how just a little light can make such a tremendous difference. The Holy Ghost is such a light.

Now think about the light of that candle being a fire. We all know, or should know, the good and bad sides of fire. The destructive force that the fire can have when set to combustible materials either to destroy, or the good force to provide heat or other energy.

The rushing wind and tongues of fire - the disciples became instantly aware of the presence of God and tongues of flames appeared atop each of them huddled in that room. Inspiration must have filled each of them to do or say something. Peter gave a sermon and 3000 were baptized that day. The 120 disciples must have been busy counseling and helping out with that. What else might they have been doing?

So once the Spirit descended upon them they were stirred to action. They got with the program. I recall once hearing a person who had just come out from a group that was very legalistic in their practices, to a church that preached grace and mercy. She was excited that now she could follow Christ's teaching not because she had to but because she wanted to. It was a real moment in her life that changed her. So with them then.

Receiving the Holy Ghost transformed the disciples and made them creatures of purposeful action. For a fire to burn it needs combustible material. The cord of wood next to the garage is useless until it is put into the fire for heat or other energy needs. Similarly the energy of the Holy Ghost in our lives is of little value until we use the combustible material of our hands, arms, legs, hearts and minds for good use. Visiting the sick, making a hot-dish for a shut in, or doing some other chore, helping those in any needy situation, giving time or energy in service to others. This is what the Holy Ghost hopes for us when we receive the spirit and energy of God. How will we use the spirit? What will we do with all the energy at our disposal? While the early disciples first began preaching I think we have other opportunities to witness today. We can get creative and ask for inspiration too. The ideas are endless; there is much to be done. Praise God!

PRISON MINISTRY NEWSLETTER June, 2017

Easter is a great day for the followers of Christ! Death has been defeated! Death and negativity is all around us these days, and the only place where we can find hope is in the Word of God. The other day after listening to too much negative world news, the Lord reminded me of the song, "He's Got the Whole World in His Hands." Proverbs 21:1 says, "The king's heart is a stream of water in the hand of the Lord; He turns it wherever He will." The Lord has everything in control. As followers of Christ we have the peace of God in our hearts!

Easter morning was especially joyful, because I had the privilege of baptizing an inmate. He has been coming to church for about four months. Two months ago I gave him a basic Bible study, "Knowing God." A week later, I asked him the question, "How long have you known the Lord?" He said, "Last week when I was doing the Bible study you gave me, it became clear to me. I surrendered my life to the Lord at that time." I was surprised because I thought he already knew the Lord! The next week he told me he was under conviction to give up his non-Christian paraphernalia and he was struggling with it. I told him to obey the Lord and he would not be sorry. With a big smile on his face he said, "I got rid of it all." Other inmates ask him why he is joyful all the time and he tells them it is because of Jesus. He informed me that his mother rededicated her life to Christ because she could tell that Christ had totally changed his life! At the baptism he gave his testimony. After hearing his story of how he grew up, I was not surprised that he came to prison. He is truly a light to other inmates around him who knew him before he knew Christ, and see his life now! Every area of his life has been made new, and he is a new person because of our resurrected Lord!

This morning I visited with three men from the same cell. One of them had been in Bible study and the weekly evening church service yesterday. He went back to his cell after the evening church service and said, "I am giving up my old life to follow Christ!" Because of his excitement about the Lord the other men were interested in wanting to know more about Jesus. I was able to have a good visit with all three of them. We talked about what it means to follow Jesus and repent of old ways. Each one was interested in filling out the Bible study, "Knowing God", which is a basic foundational study of the Christian faith.

It is exciting to see God at work in the prison! We truly do serve a risen Savior! Please continue to pray. The battle for souls is spiritual and your prayers make a difference! Thank you all for your encouragement through your financial gifts, notes and prayers!
