LET ME BE HONEST WITH MYSELF AS I LOOK INTO MY HEART AND SOUL,


NOTICING THE TIMES I TURN AWAY FROM YOU. GUIDE ME AS I HUMBLY SEEK

#### MEN'S BROTHERHOOD March 2023

**Men's Brotherhood Notes:** Men's Brotherhood met at noon on February 9, the second Thursday of the month because of a schedule conflict with a special Session meeting. After we all enjoyed a wenderful



conflict with a special Session meeting. After we all enjoyed a wonderful meal prepared by Mike and his kitchen crew, Dave Peterson presented the program. He is quite the accomplished wood carver. He showed us an assortment of wood carving tools and objects he rescued from the inside of various pieces of wood!

I just finished a book called *Unsettling Truths* by Mark Charles and Soong-Chan Rah. The topic of the book was the Doctrine of Discovery. Whenever I have talked to people about this, they seem to have never heard of it or if they have, they know very little about its history. Basically the Doctrine of Discovery was a series of Papal decrees governing the activities of the Portuguese and the Spanish as they explored and conquered the New World and Africa. The intent behind the decrees was later usurped by England and France as they explored North America.

The basic doctrine was that any lands the explorers came upon, became the property of a European power plus any peoples they encountered became slaves or they were killed. It is a rather gruesome thing as one studies the events closely.

The main reason for killing or enslaving the peoples they encountered in the New World was because they were not Christians. There is more to the story that I don't have time to cover but basically instead of just proclaiming Jesus and His love and story of His life, they were more intent on personal and national greed. Obviously this is the antithesis of Jesus' proclaiming love to all plus welcoming the stranger in their midst.

This Doctrine of Discovery was carried down through British and French law of landownership. It is yet in effect based on a couple of supreme court rulings, one as recent as 2005. I would encourage all to brush up on this topic. Meanwhile as we prepare for and enter the Lenten season we should be mindful of strangers or anyone we don't know, welcome them into our midst. (I love to chat up people at HyVee who I have never met before.) Show them the love of Christ by personal example.


