DAVID PETERSON

Congratulations to Dave Peterson for receiving the Senior Presbyterian Award 2023. As we know, Dave has been a very active and hardworking member of First Presbyterian Church since first joining in 1985. Three words I would use to describe Dave are: curiosity, integrity, and service. Learning about his story and experiences Outstanding, it's obvious that Dave's faith in God has always taken the form of action and service to others – service to his church as well as his family, community, state, and country.

From his modest childhood on a farm and working the land himself, to enlisting in the Navy and travelling the world, to higher education and teaching, Dave

found something to love in every place he lived and worked. After a devastating hailstorm, he decided that farming was too uncertain and decided to attend the University of Minnesota Morris. He enjoyed his classes but for the pragmatic Dave, the cost was just too great at that time. The armed services offered an exciting opportunity for learning, travel, and service for a Midwest farm boy. During his seven years in Navy, Dave visited many European and Caribbean countries aboard the USS Albany and the USS Littlerock. Ask him sometime about a hair-raising drive in a Corvette from Naples to the NATO US Navy Base in Gaeta Italy!

In Maryland before his first deployment, Dave became friends with a family who worked with the servicemen training nearby and he must have made a good impression on the daughter Lee who was "just a kid" at the time. They kept in contact over the years and while aboard ship in the Caribbean Sea, Dave proposed by letter. They were together for only a couple of weeks during that yearlong engagement. After finishing his Naval career, Dave was able to complete his education at the University of Minnesota on the GI Bill majoring in Physics with minors in Math and Chemistry and with an Education endorsement for teacher certification.

Dave and Lee moved to Brookings where he began teaching Physics at Brookings High School. Since Lee grew up Baptist and Dave grew up Lutheran, they took their time to find a church that fit them both. After learning of Dave's computer and electronics training in the Navy, he was quickly asked to help out with the sound system and he has been a sound technician at the church ever since.

Those years were very busy with the birth of their daughter Jessica and many contributions to our church and the Brookings community. Over the years, Dave has served as a Deacon, Elder, trustee, Crossroads class coordinator, personnel committee member, finance committee, Mission & Finance chair and our church treasurer. He will tell you that he is the first non-Fishback to be the church treasurer since the church was founded in 1882.

Over a long career in the Brookings School District, Dave taught the first computer science classes at BHS, ran tech for the theater performances, worked with SDSU, became the assistant superintendent, and served on many local boards and committees. He did all of this while also taking classes in the summer for a Master's degree and enlisting in the South Dakota National Guard. He speaks very fondly of his time as a teacher and said that he learned as much from his students as they learned from him.

After retirement, Dave remains engaged and curious with rewarding hobbies such as travelling with Lee, woodcarving, and ham radio, however it's easy to see that his most prized role is being Grandpa to Lucas (9) and Lance (almost 7). 




