




## Revelings for November



In this season of "Thanksgiving," I'm often reminded of our need to practice "Thanksliving" as an act not only of our gratitude for what God has done and provided for us, but also of the call to practice this as a spiritual discipline every day in our lives, throughout our lifetime.

We conclude our 4-part series from The Layman, Winter 2014, "Equipping for Ministry in the 21st Century." Our last lesson "The Exhortation for the Church To Have the Mind of Christ" comes from the book of Philippians. By God's grace and our faith in Jesus Christ as our savior and Lord, our life is of a different perspective. The winds and gales of November may toss us around a bit, so too do our circumstances in life, but we have an anchor to hold on to, Jesus Christ, God's Word made flesh, and the Holy Spirit's guidance to lead us onward toward doing God's will in and through our lives. The following list comes from this lesson, found in the scripture passages to read below:

- 1:27 Paul describes life lived in One Spirit with One mind as One man.
- 2:1-11 Life governed by the mind of Christ with purpose (2:15-16)

Also found are exhortations as imperatives by Paul to the church at Philippi:

- 1:27 Personal Conduct worthy of the Gospel
- 2:2 Make Paul's Joy complete
- 2:5 Have in your mind the mind of Christ Jesus
- 2:12 Work out salvation with fear and trembling
- 2:14 Do everything without grumbling/disputing
- 2:18 Rejoice and share your joy

The result of such life, authentic witness in the world. Display God's Word of truth, Jesus exalted, so God will exalt the Church. To what purpose? God's. To what end? Joy.

"What is one specific, tangible commitment you can make to more fully cooperate with the Holy Spirit's work of bringing your mind and life into greater conformity with the mind of Christ? Examine your life," is there anywhere God's will isn't clear or lacking for you to engage in prayerful discernment? "What does this reveal to you about your relationship with God? Commit yourself to live out Philippians 4:8-9 and Rejoice!"

#### Philippians 1:27-2:18, 3:15-4:9

27 Only, live your life in a manner worthy of the gospel of Christ, so that, whether I come and see you or am absent and hear about you, I will know that you are standing firm in one spirit, striving side by side with one mind for the faith of the gospel, 28and are in no way intimidated by your opponents. For them this is evidence of their destruction, but of your salvation. And this is God's doing. 29For he has graciously granted you the privilege not only of believing in Christ, but of suffering for him as well— 30since you are having the same struggle that you saw I had and now hear that I still have.

#### **Imitating Christ's Humility**

2:1 If then there is any encouragement in Christ, any consolation from love, any sharing in the Spirit, any compassion and sympathy, 2make my joy complete: be of the same mind, having the same love, being in full accord and of one mind. 3Do nothing from selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility regard others as better than yourselves. 4Let each of you look not to your own interests, but to the interests of others. 5Let the same mind be in you that was in Christ Jesus, 6 who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, 7 but emptied himself, taking the form of a servant, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form,8 he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death—even death on a cross.

9 Therefore God also highly exalted him and gave him the name that is above every name, 10 so that at the name of Jesus every knee should bend, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, 11 and every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

#### Shining as Lights in the World

12 Therefore, my beloved, just as you have always obeyed me, not only in my presence, but much more now in my absence, work out your own salvation with fear and trembling; 13for it is God who is at work in you, enabling you both to will and to work for his good pleasure. 14 Do all things without murmuring and arguing, 15so that you may be blameless and innocent, children of God without blemish in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, in which you shine like stars in the world. 16lt is by your holding fast to the word of life that I can boast on the day of Christ that I did not run in vain or labour in vain. 17But even if I am being poured out as a libation over the sacrifice and the offering of your faith, I am glad and rejoice with all of you— 18and in the same way you also must be glad and rejoice with me.

3:15Let those of us then who are mature be of the same mind; and if you think differently about anything, this too God will reveal to you. 16Only let us hold fast to what we have attained.

17 Brothers and sisters, join in imitating me, and observe those who live according to the example you have in us. 18For many live as enemies of the cross of Christ; I have often told you of them, and now I tell you even with tears. 19Their end is destruction; their god is the belly; and their glory is in their shame; their minds are set on earthly things. 20But our citizenship is in heaven, and it is from there that we are expecting a Saviour, the Lord Jesus Christ. 21He will transform the body of our humiliation so that it may be conformed to the body of his glory, by the power that also enables him to make all things subject to himself.

4:1Therefore, my brothers and sisters, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm in the Lord in this way, my beloved. 2 I urge Euodia and I urge Syntyche to be of the same mind in the Lord. 3Yes, and I ask you also, my loyal companion, help these women, for they have struggled beside me in the work of the gospel, together with Clement and the rest of my co-workers, whose names are in the book of life.

4Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. 5Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. 6Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. 7And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

8Finally, beloved, whatever is true, whatever is honourable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is pleasing, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence and if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. 9Keep on doing the things that you have learned and received and heard and seen in me, and the God of peace will be with you.

In everything give

thanks; for this is

God's will for you in Christ Jesus.

May God's glory and the mind of Christ surround and infuse us each day to practice "thanksliving."


adventures teaching English at several countries. He was home for 30 days and has returned to his fiancé in Turkey.

#### SUSAN'S SAGA

November 2021

Included in the practical admonitions of how to live as a Christ follower in the 5th chapter of Ephesians is the injunction of "trying to learn what is pleasing to the Lord."

This directive indicates being intentional in an ongoing process of determining what pleases the Lord.

Each attitude, thought, word, and action should be submitted to the crucible of what is acceptable to the Lord. The Lord's standard is the measure, not pop culture, conventional wisdom, current trends, or popular opinion.

To live out this verse means being willing to listen attentively to the Lord, tuning out the static and noise from the media, and engaging with what the Lord deems to be acceptable. God's Word is ever relevant to reveal what is pleasing to the Lord.


A corollary is found a little further on: "So then do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is." It could also mean don't be imprudent or, put positively, be sensible in understanding what the will of the Lord is. The idea is to take seriously what the Lord has in mind.

The two verses taken together are excellent guidance in a confused, disoriented world, drifting ever farther away from Godly principles.

May we take these twin directives seriously as we follow the Lord in our journey through life, intentionally interacting with Scripture.
