



From Sailboat Church: Helping Your church Rethink Its Mission and Practice by Joan Gray:

When we think of offering ourselves to God, most of us think of offering God our strengths. We hardly ever think of offering God our weaknesses and our lacks....God can use our weaknesses as well as our strengths. In fact, sometimes our weaknesses can glorify God more than our strengths. Look at it this way: when we operate out of our strengths, the focus is on us. We are in control, and it's easy to slip into thinking that we are doing it all ourselves. We're not leaving room for God to do much. But when we operate out of our weakness, we leave God plenty of room to work. We are much more aware of God's power enabling us to do what we could never do by ourselves. The focus is on God much more than on us....

God can give us what we need to get the job done, and God will use these experiences of weakness to teach us deeper truths. We may be humbled; we may be reminded that we are not perfect in painful ways. Yet these are opportunities for spiritual growth as we put ourselves in God's hands and let God do what God wants to do. If we always live only out of our strengths, we will never know the fullness of Christ's power dwelling in us.

When Jesus took the five loaves and two fish into his hands, he did not think about what a pittance it was to feed such a great crowd. Instead he focused on the power of God, and look what happened: he blessed and broke the bread, and the story says that it was enough.

An important theme throughout the book of Romans is how we can be made right with God. The opening chapters explain that it certainly isn't by our own efforts or wishful thinking that a right relationship with God can be restored. As pointed out in Chapter 3, "For everyone has sinned; we all fall short of God's glorious standard."

Even though we are the ones who are the offenders, God amazingly provides the solution. "Yet God, with undeserved kindness, declares that we are righteous. He did this through Christ Jesus when he freed us form the penalty of our sins. For God presented Jesus as the sacrifice for sin. People are made right with God when they believe that Jesus sacrificed his life, shedding his blood." In a confused and self-absorbed world, this message continues to be of vital importance in order to be restored to right relationship with Almighty God, our Creator.
