



It is a project whose mission is to provide a bed to families with children who do not have beds for the little ones to sleep in. Our next meeting will be September 20. We hope to see you then. **Prayer Concerns:** Pray for those who are strangers in our town. Pray that we show compassion, care and hospitality towards them whenever we have the opportunity.

The Stranger – Have you ever been in a foreign place where you are the stranger and everyone else knows what is happening but you have no clue? I experienced that one summer when i was in Mexico for about 8 weeks. I was with a mission group and we had some seriously unusual problems but the people were very friendly and helpful and open to us. Their aid put our group at ease and helped us survive the trip. We went to help and we were helped more by them.

Very few in our group understood Spanish so that did not make matters any easier. However there is a language in a smile that cuts across all cultures. There is a language behind hospitality and generosity that cuts across all cultures. Openness and friendliness are universal languages all their own. We made some very

good friends in a short time.

In our diverse community of Brookings we see folks from all over the world. We see them in the store, school, all over. We may see them in church. It matters not who they are or where they are, they may feel uncomfortable but our mission as Christians is to welcome the stranger in our midst. Invite them into our community and show them the love of Christ and the Holy Spirit.
